Graduation requirements:

Students must collect 240 credits during the two different modules to obtain their final certificate (absolutory) at the end of their 8th active semester. During the first module (Training Module) they need to collect 16 credits via visiting regular Ph.D. courses. **Our courses primarily require personal attendance.**

The remaining 224 credits are so-called *technical credits* and should be collected during the 8 semesters. Technical credits are to be earned for research activity, scientific activity and for preparing the thesis / dissertation. Collecting the technical credits does require the regular exchange with the supervisor(s).

At the end of the 2nd year / 4th semester Ph.D. students must pass the Complex Examination to enter the Dissertation Module.

Ph.D. students receive their final certification at the end of the 4th year / 8th semester. Within one year after receiving the final certification, the Ph.D. degree acquisition process must start. For that the candidates need to fulfill the publication requirements covering the area of dissertation and submit their PhD thesis. After a successful thesis defense the Ph.D. degree will be awarded.
